The College of Social Sciences and Public Policy, [Interdisciplinary Social Sciences \(ISS\)](#) program, and Social Entrepreneurship & Innovation Program in partnership with [Global Peace Exchange](#) are offering two social entrepreneurship internship opportunities for summer 2015 in Rwanda and Haiti.

In Kigali, Rwanda, the intern will work with [Duhugurane](#), a non-profit organization that provides business training, coaching, and support to women ages 18-25 to help them launch their own enterprises.

In Haiti, [Kouzin Dlo](#), a social enterprise project of The Archimedes Project is promoting community health by increasing access to affordable, clean water. Kouzin Dlo expects to accomplish this by building a decentralized network of Haitian women entrepreneurs to sell chlorine for household water treatment within their communities.

Scholar of the Month Dr. Samuel Staley



Dr. Staley became director of the DeVoe Moore Center in January 2014 after serving as managing director from September 2011 to December 2013. In addition to his responsibilities providing strategic direction and supervision of center operations and programs, he teaches advanced undergraduate and professional masters courses in social entrepreneurship, economic development, land use and regulation, urban policy, and research methods.

Prior to joining Florida State, Dr. Staley was the Robert W. Galvin Fellow at Reason Foundation, an internationally recognized public policy think tank based in Los Angeles. While at Reason Foundation, he managed the China Mobility Project, traveling to China more than 30 times as supervisor of academic research projects on transportation policy and finance.

Dr. Staley has more than 25 years of experience in urban policy and is the author, co-author, or editor of five books on public policy and more than 100 professional articles and reports. His research has also appeared in leading academic journals.

He earned his Ph.D. in public administration from The Ohio State University, his M.S. in applied economics from Wright State University, and B.A. in economics and public policy from Colby College. He also studied economics as a Bradley Fellow in the Center for Study of Public Choice at George Mason University from 1989-90.
