This paper extends the anthropological conception of sequelae to consider the mental health impacts on Black women in the U.S. South who are exposed to the social media distribution of police brutality videos in the U.S. The data is from the first author, Shannon Malone Gonzalez's work; as second author I contributed 50 percent of the coding/analysis of the data and contributed 30 percent of the writing of the introduction, literature review, analysis, and conclusion. I also have been solely responsible for all edits and revisions and submission of the manuscript to journals (we are on our second journal now, *Feminist Criminology*). Shannon Malone Gonzalez is an Assistant Professor of Sociology at University of North Carolina - Chapel Hill. J'Mauri Jackson is a doctoral student in Sociology at University of Michigan.

This article utilizes National Longitudinal Survey of Freshman (NLSF) data to explore interracial dating among elite college students and how their dating practices are influenced by racial (as modeled by the Multidimensional Inventory of Black Identity). The first author, who analyzed the data and ran the models, is an Associate Professor of Social Work at Columbia University and our third author, Ryan Gryder (Phd in Statistics), is one of his former graduate students from Boston University. My written contribution was to the literature review and discussion of the analysis, though I have also done much of the editing and revision work. The paper received a conditional accept at *Family Relations* on 06/2023. The revision has been submitted and we are awaiting acceptance from the editors.

Therefore, I contemplate to what extent people do or do not consent to be being touched in public queer spaces like bars and nightclubs, as well as how we might envision consequences for harm that do not prop up a carceral system. As the sole author of this chapter, I did all theorizing and writing of this chapter. The book was peer-reviewed, inclusive of every individual essay.
